EU Directive 2002/95/EG,2002/96/EC

Dear Sirs

Effective July 1, 2006, EU Directive 2002 / 95 / EG on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment (RoHS) will prohibit the use of the following substances: lead, mercury, hexavalent chromium, cadmium, PBB and PBDE.

In order to comply with this EU Directive, we have engaged a study group to guarantee that all processes are carried out and all products are manufactured under directive provisions. We also guarantee that as from November 2005 at the latest, our suppliers shall deliver only components which do not contain the aforementioned banned substances.

We aim to deliver only products that comply with EU Directive 2002 / 95 / EG from as early as the start of 2006. Such products will retain their identification and designation. During the transitional period, we shall make written declarations in all relevant documentation (offers, order confirmations, delivery notes).


We already comply with EU Directive 2002 / 96 / EC (WEEE = Waste of Electrical and Electronic Equipment) for industrial products (manufacturer and date of manufacture are stated on STS products or are traceable).
